Continuing to be open with each other about our spiritual journeys and the current climates of our faith will allow us to truly support one another as God intended ¹³. I know it will be impossible for me to individually pour into each person as much as I would like; however, I hope to approach this by first pouring into the execs and fellowship leaders so that their ministries will flourish, so ACF as a whole can blossom and bear good fruit.

God has made everything beautiful in its time¹⁴, and regardless of who He uses to serve as ACF president, I am fully confident that He will ultimately be glorified. If I am to serve as president, I hope to lead ACF such that we continually pursue a relationship with God through His Word, build up serving leaders, and support each other in our spiritual walks.
